He loved working with students of all abilities and his final years before retirement he was led to teach students between the ages of 18 and 24 teaching them life skills so that they could eventually become independent. Roger had a love for singing and he often serenaded us with his wonderful voice. He sang regularly at St. Mary's Catholic Church and would occasionally sing at the Spiritual Life Center. He was a generous and loving person to everyone and after Lorraine's passing in 2019 he spent his last year discovering who he was as a widower. He recognized it was never too late to be yourself and truly rediscover oneself. His travels to see family and friends was truly a gift he loved and cherished along with his daily walks with Holly (his dog). He made time every day for truly enjoying the beautiful gifts given him from God.

He is survived by his Brother Gary and wife Sandy (Flick) Brown, his sister Marilyn and husband Douglas Richards, his Brother-In-Law, Philip Walsh and Tess Jones and 9 nieces and nephews and 18 grandnieces and grandnephews. He and Lorraine had also become part of Jeff and Debbie Karr family, along with their 3 children.
