The day God called you home.*

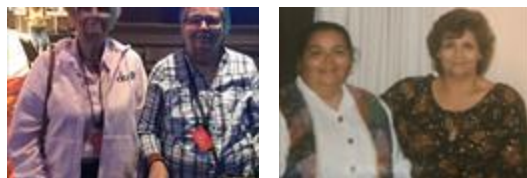
*You left us beautiful memories,
