Uncle Doyle and I had lunch at the Black Bear restaurant in Tulare , Calif the early part of February in 2013. The last time I saw him we sat there for over 3 hours laughing and talking about things from our past. We talked about going to Kettleman Hills open range to gather cattle for Mr Evans. We were joined by 3 or 4 Sheriff's deputies and other friends. We gathered cattle from 3000 acres open range. We drove them to corrals where they were branded , marked and shipped to market we slept on the ground, ate beans, fried potatoes and onions, biscuits and gravy, large chunks of beef dried apple pies. A large pot of coffee was always on the fire . We made these drives 2 times a year in the late sixties and seventies we rode our own horses It was a great bonding experience for all involved to this day. Another moment in time was in 1951 when he showed up at my dads place one morning before dawn. It was his 1st liberty from the the Navy boot camp in San Diego . My whole family was thrilled to see him . My brothers and sisters loved their uncle Doyle. I was blessed to have Uncle Doyle in my life from 1951 on . Hardly a week would go by that we would meet , have coffee, and talk he was my favorite uncle . Lupe and I will miss him forever! Now he has rode off into the sunset. He will be riding with the " Ghost riders in the sky." "Giddy up cowboy."
