“ I first met Jerry when he was enrolled in the 5th grade at St. Anne's Parochial school in Porterville. There were 7 guys & 10 gals in our grad. class in 1955. It was quite a coincidence that 3 of the 7 decided to become pharmacists. We hung out together in our senior year in high school. Jerry was a gregarious outgoing guy, funny and with a great sense of humor. We shared many memories. One was the "Dance of the Cave Blossoms" act at the Senior assembly.. It was a "hoot". We didn't receive any 10's from the judges or any 1's either. . A picture is on pg.46 of the "59 El Granito yearbook. After high school, we lost track of each other for many years and the last time I saw him was at our 45th high school reunion. Another memorable episode which seems like it just happened yesterday was the time Jerry, Roger Anderson and I were mistaken for thieves. It was a night to remember. Roger picked us up and took us out to the foothills around midnight for a drive out to where his girlfriend lived. We drove slowly passed the darkened house when Roger threw a firecracker out his window which exploded in the front of the house and reverberated throughout the valley. He parked the car about 25 yards down the dark road near Orange Groves and we followed him walking slowly up the hill. Suddenly, shots ran out and we turned around and ran like crazy laughing hysterically towards the car. We could hear bullets whizzing through the leaves of the orange trees. We were fortunate not to have been hurt. We found out that the girlfriend's father thought that someone was trying to rob gasoline from his storage tank. It was a good thing that he didn't hit his storage tank.
