Whitney High School and later become a guidance counselor, retiring in 1980. Luella and her future husband, Richard, had their first date at Mooney Grove Park – that led to their marriage in 1944. Richard preceded her in death after 54 years of marriage. The Newmans were blessed with the birth of their daughter, Beverly, later in life. Beverly and her husband, Rodger Yoshida, would enrich the lives of the Newmans with the birth of their perfect granddaughter, Carly. Luella's longevity allowed her to be a special part of Carly's childhood and she took great joy in seeing her grow into a young adult. Luella's hobby of collecting antiques would turn into a second career. She loved to find hidden treasures and deals at garage sales, auctions and the Visalia Sales Yard – where she was a regular fixture on Sunday mornings. Beverly would like to express her deep gratitude to her mother's caregiver, Debby Mustin, whose dedicated care and concern allowed Luella to maintain the dignity and independence she exhibited throughout her
