Marvin Mack George of Visalia passed away on July 1st, 2014 at the age of 90. He was born in Vincennes, Indiana on September 23, 1923 to Charles & Grace Lucille George. He graduated from Lincoln High School in Vincennes with the class of 1941. He served in the Army during World War II.
