Sabrina had a heart of compassion. She attended Valley Oak Jr High where she received a Character Counts Award for the Pillar of Respect and she attended Visalia Charter Independent Study where she and her twin really loved their cooking class and all the wonderful goodies they learned to cook and got to bring home. Sabrina and her twin, Alicia, made sure to "walk" and Graduate together which they did at Visalia Adult School. Sabrina loved taking "field trips" as they would call them with her babies to the mountains. Sabrina loved those mountain drives, and trips to the beach. And when they drove to her appointments in San Francisco they would make the most of those drives when they were all together and they would view the sites such as the San Francisco bay bridge. She loved Baker Beach and the surrounding beach areas. She loved crafting with her children and made ornaments with them at Christmas time, coloring

them together. She loved putting together lunch boxes for her children and she had lots of fun making Snapchat videos and taking fun filter photos with her babies. Sabrina just adored every second with her precious children. Sabrina, in her freest, had a very warm, sunny, and happy personality, joking and laughing with her loved ones.

Sabrina worked as a data entry clerk at Golden State Overnight just before the illness was

discovered. She had just begun school for Medical Administration until it became overwhelming

with the chemo treatments but she still kept trying for a while.

Sabrina's life was her babies and her fiance. All of her life was for them and although the last 18 months, just after diagnosis in her third trimester with little Evelyn and she was induced to

begin treatment, still, with all of the separations from her little family, the hospital stays and all

that came along with battling this awful leukemia, Sabrina's efforts for her children were her

everything. Even from the hospital bed she would maintain contact with Athena's teacher or

she'd handle all that she could from the bedside be it the bills, grocery shopping and sending

little gifts or treats via Amazon to her Nieces and Nephews or for any of the family that she

could expressing her love in any way that she could. She'd be on video calls with her babies

and Miguel all that she could grasp, she'd Snapchat with her Mom and Sisters and Sis in Laws.

She took every bit of life that she could by the reins, staying connected was everything and her

light shined for her children, her light that will illuminate through their futures

for all their years to

come. They will know how loved they were by their Mommy. Her life taken too young and we are all left grieving immensely for Sabrina, there was so much hope after the Stem Cell transplant, her younger sister Mia was her donor, never did we foresee that they would say they can't find cancer then for sepsis to begin and take our beloved Sabrina from us. We are devastated and we are all holding on staying strong together as we go one day at a time without our Brie. Our Sabrina, deeply loved and deeply missed, until we meet again. Sabrina is greeted by loved ones in Heaven: Her baby girl Isabella,
