Music wasn't just what Scott did, it was who he was, and his passion for it inspired everyone around him.

Scott's passing was the result of an accidental overdose, a heartbreaking end to a remarkable life. His family shares this not out of shame, but in hopes that

Scott's story might remind others that addiction does not discriminate, and those struggling deserve compassion, not judgement. He was so much more than the circumstances of his death.

He is survived by his cherished daughter, Morgan Greenall; his devoted mother, Beverly Mark; his brother, Mark Greenall, and his wife Jennifer; his sister, Andrea McClain, and her husband Keith; and a treasured circle of nieces and nephews who brought him so much joy.

Scott may be gone from our sight, but he will never be gone from our hearts. Those who loved him will carry his memory forward, in laughter shared, in quiet moments, and in every song that moves the soul in a way that can't quite be explained.
