Stan was greatly proud of his two sons, Ron Livingston and Imrie Livingston and would do anything for daughter Alicia Parnell, and his granddaughter Taylor Brill. He loved Ron's children Austin, Cale, and Quinn immensely and often talked of their accomplishments, including Austin and Angela's three adorable children.

Stan's move to Visalia provided a new group of friends which oddly enough, overlapped with his old friends from his golfing days and a variety of people who moved to Visalia from Elderwood and Woodlake. Many of these friends attended church with him and provided a huge amount of support for his family as he quietly sat and listened, enjoying the soft laughter and conversation flowing around him.
